HOW TO SABOTAGE YOUR GROUP IN 5 EASY STEPS

If you're looking to make things awkward and ruin *Vertical Marriage* for everyone in your group, especially your spouse, here's how:

Step 1: Share embarrassing details about your marriage

Nothing screams "I'm never coming back!" like hearing your spouse tell the group juicy details you'd rather discuss privately. (This will be especially helpful in Session 4.)

Step 4: Push through boundaries

Group discussion questions are written to be non-threatening. But even so, someone may feel uncomfortable answering and opt to stay silent. Don't let them! Ignore their boundaries and press for details.

Step 2: Jump on your soapbox

Some groups focus on lame stuff like encouragement and praying together. Boring! Instead, suck the energy out of your group with lengthy opinionated monologues. Then quickly correct those who dare to share a different perspective.

Step 3: Judge early and often

Not every marriage is in the same place, but they should be. And it's your job to let them know it.

Step 5: What's said here doesn't have to stay here

Over the course of five sessions your group will build an environment of trust. This provides the perfect setting to uncover details about each couple that your entire friend network should know about.

Note

If you prefer an affirming group experience, then do the opposite!

KICKSTARTER
