SPOUSE-OLOGY

OVERVIEW

Spouseology is a team trivia game where couples compete to see which couple will be at the top of the class.

After rolling the die to determine the category, husbands (Ask Him cards) or wives (Ask Her cards) will be asked a question from the relevant category. Before they answer, their spouse will predict their answer by writing it on their answer board. Couples whose answers match receive points!

Contents

- 120 Ask Her cards
- 120 Ask Him cards
- 1 die
- 1 scoreboard
- 6 answer boards
- 6 dry erase markers

Setup

- Give each couple an answer board, dry erase marker and an Off-Script card.
- Put the piles of Ask Him and Ask Her cards and the score-board in the middle of the table.
- The most recently married goes first.

GAME PLAY

Past, Present & Future

- 1) The starting couple rolls the die to determine the category and draws the top Ask Her card.
- 2) The husband reads the question aloud from the designated category, along with the multiple-choice answers.
- 3) Each husband writes the answer they believe their wife will choose on their answer board (A, B, C, or D... or another answer if they have held up their Off-Script card). Couples take turns revealing their answers
- with each wife announcing their answer verbally—followed by their husband presenting their written answer to the group.
- **4)** Matching answers earn 1 point, or 2 points with a 2x roll, or 3 points when an Off-Script card is played.
- 5) To start the next round, the couple to the left rolls the die, draws a card from the Ask Him deck, and spouses swap roles!





Wild Card

A couple who rolls Wild Card on the die gets to choose the category for that round.



2x Points

If 2x is rolled on the die, all answers this round will be worth twice what they would normally be. The die should be rolled again to determine the category (if 2x is rolled again, treat it as a Wild Card).



Off-Script

After hearing the question, the spouse answering the question may hold up their Off-Script card. This indicates to their spouse that they will not be choosing A, B, C or D, but will be providing their own answer to the question. If both spouses provide matching answers they score 3 points!

END OF GAME

The game ends after Round 10 (for a shorter game) or Round 20 (for a longer game), or whenever you choose to stop.

Whichever couple has the highest total score is the winner.

ADDITIONAL WAYS TO PLAY

Interdisciplinary Studies Mode

Whichever couple is the first to score 3 points in every category is the winner.

Study Partners Mode

For a single couple: Compare your final score to the number of rounds you played. If your score is higher, you win! Or, try to exceed your previous high score as a couple (in the same number of rounds).
